PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Parafield Gardens Swim School aims to provide a Child Safe Environment and are committed to creating a safe and enjoyable place for children, vulnerable people and other patrons. All patrons must adhere to these Conditions of Entry regarding use of photographic devices whilst visiting the Parafield Gardens Swim School.

You must seek Management approval before taking any photos or video recordings.

- Photographic devices include: cameras, mobile phones with cameras, and any other device with the ability of capturing a still or moving image.
- All patrons are to be respectful to one another, which includes respecting the views of other parties.
- If you capture an image of another child, individual or instructor, you must have all relevant individuals (or their parents) consent to use the images.
- You cannot broadcast or publish images or video footage without consent from all parties included in the footage/image.
- If you capture a private conversation of others when using a video camera or mobile phone, delete the footage or obtain all relevant individual consent to retain.
- Under no circumstance are cameras, video cameras or mobile phones to be used in the changeroom areas or showers.
- Management reserve the right to view any images taken. Refusal may result in the Police being called to view theses images and the Police will then take appropriate action to address our concerns.
- Failure to follow these conditions of entry may result in:
 - You being removed or banned from the centre: and/or
 - The Police being contacted; and/or
 - Staff holding onto photographic device until the Police arrive
 - Any CCTV footage captured by our security system being made available to Police
- Taking photos or recordings of someone without their consent may be considered failing to abide by these conditions of entry and could result in breach of Section 26D of the Summary Offences Act 1953 for indecent filming. This attracts a maximum fine of \$20,000 or 4 years imprisonment.
